On Saturday, July 27, a coalition of local organizations is holding a #CUNoCages public art demonstration and vigil to protest Trump's mass raids and border cages. This vigil and demo is intended to draw attention to the immigration crisis taking place at the US-Mexico border, but also in Champaign-Urbana.

To bring local awareness to the dire situation children face at the border, cages will be erected in front of the Champaign County Courthouse in downtown Urbana.
